Green belt update - some mixed news for Toton

On Wednesday, Broxtowe Borough Council began to see sense and took the first steps towards protecting our green belt. In a surprise move the ruling Labour/Lib Dem group announced fields north of Toton would no longer be deemed one of their "preferred sites". .

This came after Conservative Councillors proposed a motion opposing the

Thanks to residents green belt land north of Toton is now off the Councils preferred sites list. But the Council have revealed plans to build 2,500 homes on Chetwynd Barracks! As Toton people know the land is owned by developers and despite the Councils change of heart the land remains a prime target for development with an application anticipated sooner rather than later.

Thank you for helping to win the first battle; but there are many more to come!

figure of almost 6,000 houses accepted by the controlling group which would see up to 4,000 houses on our green belt.

Toton residents were, understandably celebrating Wednesday's news but on Thursday evening the Council revealed they were in talks with the Ministry of Defence to build 2,500 houses on Chetwynd Barracks. My enquiries at the MOD have revealed that Chetwynd is NOT on the recently published list of land to be sold for development. I have arranged a meeting with the MOD to discover exactly what is being proposed.

The campaign to protect our green belt continues with public meetings in Nuthall and Greasley. Everyone, wherever you live in Broxtowe, is welcome. Full details below.

EU Referendum vote

I did not vote for a referendum on the EU as I believe it was the wrong motion at the wrong time. I was elected on a manifesto that did not promise a referendum on the EU but did promise a referendum if yet more powers were to be handed from Britain to Brussels and the Government has delivered on that promise.

I think most sensible people agree that the EU has strayed far too far from its original premise as a free trade area with a strong determination to work together in peace. It is now a grossly expensive, undemocratic and bureaucratic organisation facing hugely difficult times given the crisis in the Eurozone. But I believe we are better in than out; given the state of our economy and the profound uncertainties in the Eurozone I do not believe a referendum on our continued membership would be in Britain's interest.

The Boundary Commission has recommended boundary changes to equalise the number of people MP's represent and to cut the numebr of seats by 50.

Their plans would see Broxtowe extend to Gotham, Barton-in Fabis and Thrumpton.
